ORDER OF A NEW ARCOMET A47 CITY

CRANE

We are delighted to introduce you to the newest member of our fleet, the Belgian built Arcomet A47 Self-Erecting City Crane. This new machine is based on the previous A45 Eco City but, this time, it features a 47 metre jib and a maximum capacity of 6 tonnes. A key difference between the old model and this latest version is that it only requires a 32 amp power source, as opposed to its predecessors which required 63 amps. Other changes include structural modifications to allow for more versatility.




We are proud to be able to welcome the A47 to our already extensive fleet and we are looking forward to seeing it representing Falcon at sites across the UK and beyond.

BIRCH IS GROWING IN SIZE AND A NEW SHOT BLAST FACILITY WILL BE OPERATIONAL BY THE END

A great deal has been said about the size and status of our head office in Shipdham but the importance of our sister office in Birch should not be underestimated. The team in Manchester provides a hub for much of our activity in the north of the UK, as well as managing all the ancillary items that Falcon provides.

Alongside Kevin Bird (Yard Manager) and Matthew Hill (Office Assistant) the depot currently employs 18 people, with more joining in January. These office staff alongside our fantastic team of yard staff, ensure we have dedicated members of staff covering all corners of our operations.

At Birch, there is an on-site Liebherr 220 tower crane, two trucks and a pickup van which are used to manage all auxiliary items and lighting. These include aviation

lights, floodlights and illuminated signs, all of which keep our sites across the UK well lit. In addition to this, our generator division is managed from Birch, as is the hire and sale of all our fuel tanks, hybrid generators and fuel management systems. All anti-climb frames and lockable mast hatches also come from here, as well as all lifting equipment.

Kevin Bird, who leads the operation in Birch explains, "While Birch is relatively small in size, its importance

to the company is huge. Our team here does a fantastic job, essentially being the bridge between head office and the rest of the country." He expands by saying, "I think that Birch is a very important asset to Falcon as, not only does it provide a northern yard, reducing transport costs for the company, but also, it gives customers a dedicated point of contact for all the additional items that go with the crane."

Birch is growing in size and a new shot blast facility will be operational by the end of the year; it will be used, not only for our own equipment, but also for external work. In addition to this, a new fabrication workshop is on its way soon, so watch this space! The future is looking good and it seems Birch is preparing to write the next chapter of the Falcon story.

Talking of the future, two new staff members will be joining the team soon, so we look forward towelcoming Andrew Walker, who will be taking up his position as a



fabricator, and Kevin Swales, who joins as an electrician.
